# FROM THE PASTOR

At the beginning of each month I send to the San Angelo District office a form titled, "Vital Signs: Pastor's Monthly Report. This form shows results from the previous month and tracks some of statistics that help our district superintendent and our bishop see where we are growing as faithful disciples of Jesus Christ.

These numbers are broken down into three broad areas: **Membership**, **Worship Attendance** and **Church School Attendance**. Of course it can be argued that these numbers don't tell the whole story of whether we are growing as disciples who are growing in the faith. But the numbers do point to trends that can help us hone in on those areas where we might be needing to spend more time and resources in order to continue to grow, both numerically and spiritually.

Also on the form is a place to record the goals each church has for the current year in these three areas. I pray about these reports and the souls who are reflected in the numbers on each page. This is what I believe is possible in 2011:

For Iraan, I believe that we can grow from our current membership (at the beginning of January) from 61 to 70 this year. At the same time as we grow in numbers we can grow as disciples who spend time in ministry, study, and worship. This would be reflected in the goal of reaching 25 (up from 17) every Sunday in worship and 15 (up from6) in church school (in at least two classes).

For McCamey, I believe that we can grow from our current membership (at the beginning of January) from 92 to 105 this year. This will be a challenge as more than 25 names are due to be removed from the membership roll at the next church conference. At the same time, as we grow in numbers we can also grow as disciples who spend time in ministry, study, and worship. This would be reflected in the goal of reaching 50 every Sunday morning in worship (with another 20 at the McCamey Convalescent Center) and 20 in church school (in at least two classes).

I believe our God has commissioned each one of us to share the good news, to grow in the faith we have claimed, and to come together at every opportunity to celebrate the transformation of the world in the name of the Risen Christ.




The January meeting of the **United Methodist Women** took place in the parlor of the FUMC in McCamey with nine present.


The fellowship hall at FUMC – Iraan comes alive every Sunday morning before the worship service. Come and join us!


## McCamey Convalescent Center Ministry
