From the Pastor

"March Madness," the very mention of the phrase causes the hearts of many sports fans to start racing and likely as many non-sport fans to roll their eyes in mock horror. This refers, of course, to the NCAA basketball tournament which begins with the conference tournaments, continues with "Selection Sunday" and continues through "the brackets" complete with "bracket buster upsets," all the way to the "Final Four" and the eventual crowning of a new champion.

There are a lot of traditions that have developed over the years since the first men's tournament in 1939. Then, only eight teams were involved; in 2012, sixty-eight schools will take part. In the years since that first tournament, thirty-five teams have "cut down the nets." Among the women, fourteen teams have claimed the prize since the first NCAA tournament in 1982.

I mention this about the basketball tournaments because it occurs to me that the Church is also engaged in its own version of "March Madness." No, we are not going to gather in the school gym for a church-wide free-throw contest (though that might be fun!). Rather, we are already into the season of Lent and the lead-up that will see us arriving once more on Easter morning.

As happens all too frequently in the life of the Church, and in the lives of individual Christians, we can get "all spun-up" in the busy-ness of the Church, in the frenetic whirl that is our own life, and forget to enjoy the gift of God that is life.

The purpose of Lent you see isn't to make us tired from yet another obligation to squeeze into an already full calendar. It isn't supposed to make us desire to get to Easter so that we can move on to the next event which already is peering around the corner of our calendars.

No, the season of Lent is designed so that our time isn't "mad," but purpose-filled with the grace of God that comes from being present with and to God. I invite you then, as you move through the days given to you this month, to "ponder anew what the Almighty can do" in your life and in the world unfolding with promise – not mad, but marvelous!

GIFTS

FUMC – Iraan: It was reported at the February Ad Board the following concerning our giving in support of the ministries of the congregation: The budget for 2012 is \$55,875, or \$4,656.25 per month. In January, we received \$2,760 with \$7,178.79 being spent (including \$3,551.17 for property insurance for the year). The amount spent did not include any payments toward our share of the 2012 apportionments.

FUMC – McCamey: It was reported at the February Ad Board the following concerning our giving in support of the ministries of the congregation: The budget for 2012 is \$85,267 or \$7,105 per month. In January, we received \$6,817.10 with \$6,847.93 being spent. Our expenses each month include \$824.30 (10% of our 2012 apportionments) and \$817.23 for property insurance.


